The tree that was pushing over the pergola at the 6th bed has been removed by Paul Barnett and Peter Hall. The damage to the building has been repaired by Bob Laird.


Daniel Hill is very generously sharing his expertise with the club and will develop an action plan for the course.


Daniel also fertilised all the greens last Monday morning. David will organise with Jamie for the spraying of lime and fertiliser by McDougall's as soon as possible.
